Have your say on proposals to improve travel on foot or by bike in your area

Consultation closes 5 July 2022











Proposals to revolutionise travel on foot or by bike in your area

We are looking to make some changes to the roads in your area, with the aim of making your neighbourhood safer and more pleasant and encouraging more people to walk and cycle for short journeys.

Work has started on a Greater Manchester-wide programme to make journeys on foot or by bike easier and more attractive through the creation of The Bee Network. Once built, the network will better connect every community in Greater Manchester, making cycling and walking a real alternative to the car.

In support of this ambition, the Mayor of Greater Manchester has allocated £160 million to the Mayor's Cycling and Walking Challenge Fund. This has been made possible thanks to the national government's Transforming Cities Fund which is investing in public and sustainable transport to improve productivity and spread prosperity

In partnership with Stockport Council, we have developed the following proposals which we would like your feedback on.

Northgate Road, Old Chapel Street and Ingleton Road


We are proposing to introduce 'no waiting at any time' restrictions (double yellow lines) around the junction of Northgate Road with Old Chapel Street and Ingleton Road to improve sight lines and safety for all road users. The restrictions will only extend for about a car length from the corner on each arm to minimise loss of parking for residents.

Edgeley Road/Northgate Road/ Edgeley Fold

We are proposing to create a signal junction at Northgate Road/Edgeley Road. The changes will provide an additional pedestrian crossing point, plus a new segregated cycle crossing facility. They will also make it safer for traffic to exit Northgate Road. The new walking and cycling facilities will connect Edgeley Fold and Northgate Road, improving the local access to the park and school.

In order to accommodate the new junction, one small street tree will need to be removed; this will be replaced with at least two new trees within the vicinity. In addition, the bus stop and shelter on Edgeley Road, to the east of Northgate Road, will need to be moved further east, clear of the junction. Some new parking restrictions will also be required on Northgate Road, Edgeley Road and Edgeley Fold.

Edgeley Road/Dale Street

We are proposing to provide new 'green-man' pedestrian crossing facilities at the existing signal junction of Edgeley Road/ Dale Street.

In addition, we plan to provide Advance Stop Lines to create a waiting area for cyclists when the traffic lights are on red.

Cheadle Old Road, south of Alexandra Park

We are proposing to amend the existing access controls (bollards and gate) on the Cheadle Old Road path, through Alexandra Park, so that legitimate users (e.g. those using double buggies or adapted cycles) are not obstructed or inconvenienced. Some new double yellow lines are also proposed. We will also consider street lighting improvements can be made to help make the path feel safer.





How can I give my views on the proposed changes?

Transport for Greater Manchester (TfGM) is working with Stockport Council to ensure all residents, businesses and other stakeholders are kept up-to-date on all changes and plans for the scheme.

There is a consultation on these proposed changes, where you can give your views. The consultation closes 5 July 2022.
