WHO CAN PARTICIPATE?

Every year, thousands of people take part in clinical research studies, helping **test potential new treatments** that may make life better. Each clinical trial has rules about who can participate called **inclusion/exclusion criteria**. These rules as well as the potential risks and benefits of the clinical trial are captured in the **informed consent process**. These criteria are developed with much thought and consideration. They are necessary to prove whether medicines work or not in a specific patient population and make sure the appropriate participants enter the trial and **stay safe**. Each participant can drop out of the clinical trial **at any time** even after they have agreed to participate.

A clinical trial or research study is the backbone of medicine development. Before reaching your medicine cabinet, each medicine underwent years of scientific studies in people like you to evaluate whether the treatment was safe and effective.

-  Is the investigational medicine effective?
-  Is it more effective than another established treatment?
-  Is it safe and/or what are its side effects?
