

# STH101 Introduction to Theology Syllabus Highlights

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## **Course Description**

A study of the nature, method, and sources of theology; general and special revelation, including the inspiration and authority of Holy Scripture; and canonicity.

### **Learning Outcomes**

The primary outcome is to grasp the confessional Reformed understanding of the nature and sources of theology, with a particular focus on the Reformed doctrine of Scripture. At the end of this course of study, successful students will be able to:

- 1. Analyze different theological methods and be able to explain the ways in which methodology can and does impact the content of theological systems.
- 2. Explain the relation between philosophy and theology and analyze the ways in which a theologian's underlying philosophical assumptions shape his or her theology.
- 3. Explain the late medieval ecclesio-sacerdotal soteriological system of Roman Catholicism with a goal toward understanding exactly what Reformed theology re-formed in the sixteenth century and why such theological reformation was necessary.
- 4. Explain and defend the confessional Reformed understanding of the canon, inspiration, and attributes of Holy Scripture.
- 5. Critically evaluate the arguments of theological texts and clearly communicate the findings in writing.
