### Course Description

Following the structure of the Hebrew Bible, this course surveys the books designated as the Prophets: Joshua, Judges, Samuel, Kings, Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel, and the twelve Minor Prophets.

## Learning Outcomes

The student will be able to

- 1. Summarize the history of Israel from its entry into Canaan to the destruction of Jerusalem and the temple in 586 BC, providing dates as well as names for the prominent people and events of the era.
- The student will be able to summarize the messages of the prophets from the period, as well as the messages of the three postexilic prophets.
