





11 AM • Distance Nerding Presents

Local podcasters of Distance Nerding present trivia, an overview of CrockerCon, and feature surprise guests and prizes!

12 PM • Heroic Girls • Representation Matters

John Marcotte, founder of the nonprofit Heroic Girls, leads a panel of experts, including cartoonist and graphic designer LeRoid David, on the topic of representation in popular media and pop culture.

1PM • Mary Shyne and Lex Fajardo • Creating Comics & Work at the Charles M. Schulz Studio

Comic book creators Mary Shyne (You and Me on Repeat) and Lex Fajardo (Kid Beowulf) share their insights into making their own work stand out while also preserving the storied legacy of one of the most beloved comic strips of all time, Peanuts, via their work at the **Charles M. Schulz Studio**.

2 PM • Spotlight: Jack Kirby ft. Mark Badger and Bruce Simon

Graphic novelists and comic creators Mark Badger and Bruce Simon present and talk about the life and legacy of famed comic artist Jack Kirby. Often seen as "The King of Comics," Kirby left indelible marks on the medium of comics and the art world. In collaboration with the **Jack Kirby Museum and Research Center**, Mark Badger and Bruce Simon offer keen insights into Kirby's impact as a prolific artist of the 20th century who continues to impact modern culture.

3 PM • Spotlight: Mike Norton

Artist and comic creator Mike Norton has illustrated on numerous superhero books from Marvel, DC, and Dark Horse, all while producing many beloved creator-owned series like the Eisner Award-winning webcomic-turned-print series Battlepug. He was co-creator of Revival, which was released as a TV series this summer. This spotlight panel highlights Mike's accomplishments and is co-presented with Distance Nerding.

Studio Workshops

1PM • Expressing the Self in Comics with Yasmeen Abedifard

Join comic artist Yasmeen Abedifard for a fun and creative workshop designed for all ages! In this fast-paced, hands-on session, you'll turn emotions into characters, using your own personality as inspiration. Advance registration for this session is required at the Information Table.

With Yasmeen's guidance, you'll learn how to bring your character to life on the page and even start your own mini comic.

2 PM • Making Comics with Eddie Ahn

Comic creator Eddie Ahn lends insight into his creative process and his approach to making the bestselling graphic memoir Advocate. Arts, Letters, and Power: Van Dyck and the Portrait Print THROUGH OCT 12, 2025

Soon after his return from Italy to his native Flanders in 1627, the famed portraitist Anthony van Dyck began a series of etchings depicting the illustrious people of his day. Beginning with 15 etchings by his own hand, Van Dyck provided the designs for what became more than 100 prints of painters, musicians, humanists, and international rulers.

Step back in time with comic artist Chris Wisnia and a Museum docent for an interactive exhibition tour. Explore the world of Anthony van Dyck, one of history's most famous portrait artists, and learn why his art was such a big deal in aristocratic society.

Tour starts at 11 AM outside of second floor gallery.

Cara and Diego Romero: Tales of Futures Past THROUGH OCT 12, 2025

Bringing together the work of photographer Cara Romero (Chemehuevi/American) and ceramic artist Diego Romero (Cochiti/American), Tales of Futures Past is the first exhibition focusing on the artistic dialogue between the two leading artists. While the Romeros, a husband-wife duo, maintain individual studio practices, their work shares common themes concerning the complexities and the evolutionary nature of Indigenous identity and contemporary life.

Take a super-powered guided tour of the exhibition with comic artist Chris Wisnia and a Museum docent! Discover how the artists mix pop culture, Indigenous imagery, sci-fi, and comic book styles to tell bold new stories.

Tour starts at 3 PM outside of second floor gallery.

CrockerTron

On behalf of the Crocker Art Museum, we are so excited to have Matt Crouch illustrate the 10th CrockerTron. The CrockerTron tradition started with the 2015 CrockerCon and was a collaboration between myself and artist Sean K. Sutter. Each year, my goal has been to find a local illustrator to reimagine and recreate CrockerTron using their own artistic perspective.

This year, the Museum was delighted to collaborate with the **Short Center**, a **Developmental Disabilities Service** Organization (DDSO) program, to bring Matt's artistic style to this year's CrockerTron. The Short Center has been providing arts-based programming for adults with developmental disabilities since 1978, empowering personal growth through the arts. They often go one step further for the artists they nurture by creating opportunities through exhibitions in galleries and art collectives across Sacramento. Matt's love of comic characters like the X-Men and Ninia Turtles and his use of pop culture riffs within his own art practice—often painting skateboard decks and creating on large canvases—made him the ideal artist for this year's poster.

For me, this year's CrockerTron reaffirms that comics are truly for everyone. Comic books tell fantastical stories of immigrants, outsiders, and strangers, often thrust into uncertain and dangerous times. These heroes band together to become something greater than any one of them could be individually. They expose, defy, and defend us from forces that often represent intolerance, hate, and cruelty. Especially in times of villainy, comics can clearly illuminate how even those who may seem meekest have strong voices that lead us all toward greater callings and a sense of shared purpose.

Please join me in thanking Matt and the team at the DDSO Short Center South who helped make this year's CrockerTron possible. As you look up from the exhibitor floor, you can admire many of the CrockerTrons of years past or pose with a past CrockerTron in spaces around the Museum.
