School in the Spotlight

St Patrick's College Shorncliffe – Encouraging Boys to Enter the Healthcare Workforce

We're thrilled to spotlight St Patrick's College (Shorncliffe) for its proactive role in encouraging boys to pursue careers in healthcare, an industry where male representation remains significantly underrepresented. Our recent video, produced in partnership with the school, captures the unique pathways available to boys looking to enter the healthcare and community services industry.

The Need for Males in Healthcare:

As outlined by the <u>Australian Institute of Health and Welfare (AIHW)</u>, males make up only 26% of Australia's healthcare workforce, underscoring the significant gender imbalance within the field. While about 45% of medical practitioners are male, this drops to just 12% among registered nurses. Other critical areas, such as aged and disabled care, are seeing a slight increase in male representation, now at 23%. These statistics highlight an opportunity for young men to significantly impact healthcare roles traditionally occupied by women.

The push for more excellent male representation in healthcare is not just about balancing the scales—it's about providing diverse care perspectives that better serve our communities. St Patrick's College is helping to meet this need by equipping its students with the skills and qualifications required to pursue meaningful and essential careers in healthcare.

This term, we celebrated the success of our 2023/24 School-based Traineeships – and our first cohort of Deadly Start students successfully complete the program. Celebrations were held across the state recognising the hard work and dedication of the past 18 months as students complete their HLT33115 Certificate III in Health Services Assistance or HLT33021 Certificate III in Allied Health Assistance as well as 375 hours on the job training with Queensland Health.

School-based Trainee at Mackay Hospital Domonik Battersby felt very "at home" working in the paediatric department at Mackay Base Hospital, in addition to spending time in the surgical unit, wound clinic, and emergency department.

"This traineeship has been a real stepping stone for me to realising my dream,"

Domonik said. "I've worked different shifts, seen many different aspects of working in

healthcare and heard some really interesting stories; it's helped finalise my decision to work towards being a nurse," he said.

School-based Trainee Charlotte from Caboolture Health Hub was also recognized for her hard work and dedication to her role as she was awarded Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Student of the Year and School-based Trainee of the Year for the North Coast Region at the 2024 Queensland Training Awards. Charlotte says the "Deadly Start Program has given me another pathway and has helped me personally find what I want to do after High School. It is amazing to connect with other Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Students from other schools and I have made many more friendships throughout this traineeship. It also teaches you a lot of new things you wouldn't learn in a School."

We are looking forward to celebrating the remaining cohorts who will graduate from their School-based Traineeships in the coming weeks. We also thank Queensland Health, Seed Foundation and Seed Employment on their partnerships with making this program happen.



Applications for the Deadly Start School-Based Traineeship Program for 2025-2026 have now open.

Partnering with Queensland Health, Connect 'n' Grow (as the Registered Training Provider), in partnership with Seed Foundation Australia and Seed Employment (GTO) is offering culturally supportive pathways for your future Year 11 students to kickstart their careers in health.

By completing the **HLT23221 Certificate II in Health Support Services** during the first six months, students
then become eligible to progress into a hospital-based
traineeship and earn while they learn, working towards
their **HLT33115 Certificate III in Health Services Assistance.**



FUNDING AVAILABLE

VETiS funding eligibility

Senior high school students who are Australian or New Zealand Citizens or permanent residents, or temporary residents with the necessary visa, are eligible to utilise VETiS funding. Subsidised by the Queensland Government under the Vocational Education and Training in Schools Program (VETiS). Students are eligible to use VETiS funding to complete one program only. Fee-for-Service (not government subsidised)
