OAKNORTH YOUNG ENTREPRENEURS PROGRAM

UChicago's <u>OakNorth</u> program is a one-year immersive program sponsored by Rishi Khosla and focused on fostering the next generation of entrepreneurs. The program is built on three elements: entrepreneurship fundamentals, mentorship, and practice application. First-year students are paired with a mentor in the industry, and in turn, they mentor a high school student interested in the space. In parallel, students receive programming to ground them in the foundations of entrepreneurship while participating in a year-long startup development project, culminating in a pitch competition.
