



## ROGERS SCHOLARS PROGRAM IN FINANCE

Your organization can hire a fully subsidized summer intern and discover a dynamic new talent pool by partnering with UChicago’s **Rogers Scholars Program in Finance**.

Supported by a generous gift from John W. Rogers, Jr., chairman and CEO of Ariel Investments, the program connects employers with exceptionally talented UChicago internship candidates, many of whom come from underrepresented backgrounds. All student participants have received extensive training for internships with nonprofit endowments and investment offices.

### ELIGIBILITY

Nonprofit endowments and investment offices in all geographic locations are welcome to participate. To be eligible, employers must commit to:

- Creating a substantive, project-based internship of approximately 400 hours for their student
- Providing the student with an immediate supervisor or mentor
