APPLICATION RESOURCES

The Current Applicant Support Series (CASS) provides personalized, comprehensive support for all aspects of the application:

- Med schools consider **undergraduate GPA** when evaluating your application and recognize that UChicago offers a rigorous curriculum. Because med schools don't prefer certain majors, you should pursue the major that interests you.
- Careers in Healthcare advisers can share **detailed statistics** about med school admissions outcomes for individual med schools based on major, GPA, and other factors.
- Med schools typically require at least three academic **letters of recommendation**—from faculty who know you and your intellectual and analytical abilities, as well as additional letters from professional, research, and patient experiences. We can help you choose the best letters to showcase your holistic strengths and preparation for med school.
- MCAT, the standardized test required by all med schools, is offered multiple times a year. Students should begin MCAT prep at least three months in advance, after completing the science prerequisite courses. UChicago offers two Mock MCATs each year to help you gauge your preparation for this important test. Take the MCAT by the end of May so that you are ready to submit your application in June.
- **Personal Statements** and **Secondary Essays** are opportunities to share the motivations, values, and experiences that inform your decision to pursue medicine. We offer <u>unlimited statement reviews</u> to help you take advantage of this crucial part of the application.
