## **Specialized Preprofessional Programs**

- Pozen Global Health Scholars Program: selective program that offers skill trainings, internships, and networking opportunities with employers like Amnesty International, the Peace Corps, Physicians for Human Rights, and the U.S. State Department
- Global Health Frontiers: helps first-year students jumpstart their global health journey with summer workshops, a global health case project, and funded internships
- Kiphart Collegiate Fellows Program: provides students with stipends to support experiential learning internships in global health and social development, typically focused on the Global South

# College Research Programs

- African Studies Research Grant: funds students conducting summer research in Africa
- Foreign Language Acquisition Grant: offers awards to support the costs of intermediate or advanced language study abroad over the summer
- Quad Undergraduate Research Scholars Grants: offers competitive, open-discipline grants for faculty- mentored research during both the academic year and the summer
- Straetz International Undergraduate Research Scholars Program: supports advanced research opportunities outside the United States during the summer
- Summer International Travel Grant: sponsors students conducting 6-8 weeks of summer research outside the U.S.
- Quad Undergraduate Research Conference Grants: funds conference participation by current undergraduates to present a poster or deliver an oral presentation on a faculty-mentored research project at an academic conference
- Undergraduate Research Symposium: gives undergraduate researchers from across all disciplines and all years opportunities to present their research in poster or oral presentation sessions
