- **Cultural Immersion**: Classes and activities on Chinese history, society, and traditions including tea art workshops.
- Excursions & Site Visits: Explore historic and cultural landmarks such as the Great Wall, Tiananmen Square, and the Forbidden City.

How To Apply

Applicants must submit a resume that clearly outlines their Mandarin proficiency. Applications must also include a one-page cover letter addressing fit for the program, interest in Chinese language and culture, commitment to learning about clean energy in China, and overall expectations for the experience.

Applications will be reviewed on a rolling basis - students are encouraged to apply early!
