Why the Audio Center?

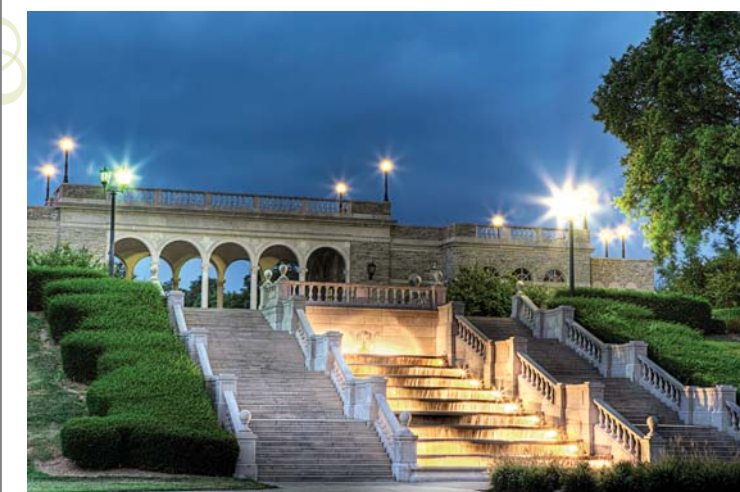
Because we are a really awesome group! Everyone's willing to pitch in where needed, and we're always willing to take the time to listen to those who need just need to talk.
