5. Spring Grove Cemetery/ Devou Park (tie)

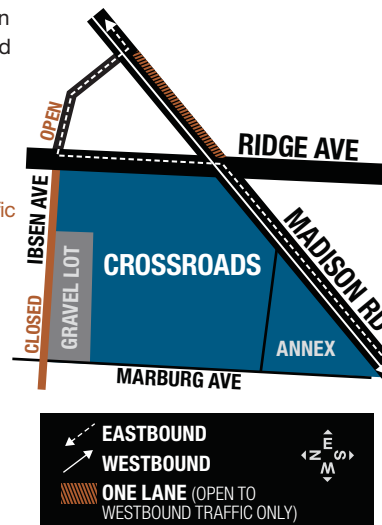
