

WHY I LOVE CINCINNATI: ENTERTAINMENT.

If you're looking for something to do this summer, Cincinnati offers a lot of options. Whether you'd like to check out some animals at the zoo, watch one of our pro sports teams or ride a coaster, here's just a few things around town to entertain you and your family:



The Cincinnati Zoo opened in 1875, making it the second oldest zoo in the U.S. It was designated as a National Historic Landmark in 1987, due to its significant architecture, and is rated as one of the best zoos in the nation. It has one of the largest collections in the country, housing more than 500 animal and 3,000 plant species.

The Cincinnati Reds were the first Major League Baseball team. Their starting season was in 1869 as the Cincinnati Red Stockings. The Reds have since been part of many firsts, including the first opening day parade in 1891 and the first night game in MLB history at Crosley Field in 1935. About 30 former Reds are now immortalized in the Hall of Fame.





The Bengals first came to Cincinnati in 1937 as a member of the American Football League. The AFL and the Bengals both folded after the 1941 season, as the U.S. entered World War II. They returned to Cincinnati 26 years later in 1967 as an expansion franchise. Their last Super Bowl appearance was in 1989, where they lost to the San Francisco 49ers 20-16. We're still waiting for another chance.

Kings Island sits on 364 acres north of Cincinnati and boasts over 80 rides, shows and attractions, including the Beast, the world's longest wooden rollercoaster.
