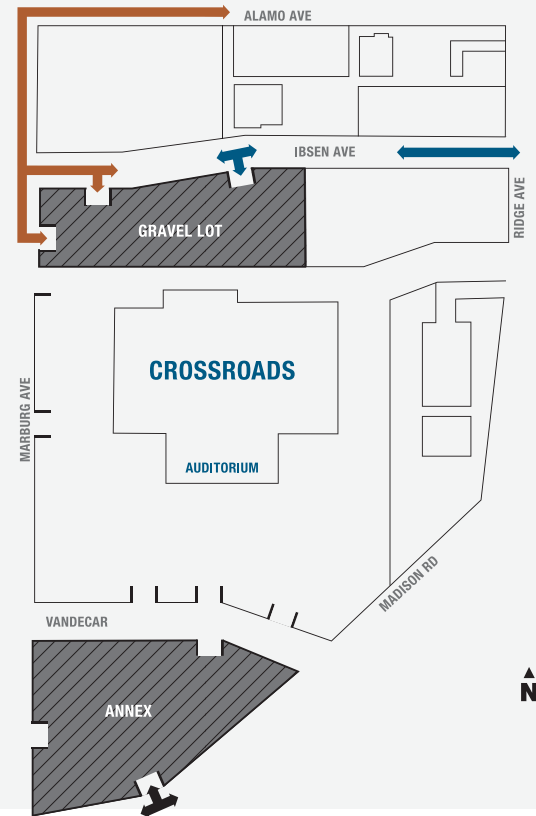
you can PARK HERE

If you go to Crossroads Mason, you can enjoy the acres of asphalt at your disposal and skip this, but if you've been searching for the best place to park your sweet ride at Crossroads Oakley on the weekend, here are some helpful tips.

FROM HYDE PARK/OAKLEY
Park in the Annex lot using the entrance on Madison Rd.

FROM 71 S
Heading up Madison Rd from Red Bank, take a right onto Ibsen. Park in the gravel lot behind Crossroads Oakley.

FROM 71 N
From the Ridge Rd exit, take the first right onto Marburg. Park in the gravel lot at the corner of Ibsen and Marburg. When exiting, take a right onto Marburg and a right onto Alamo. Turn left on Ridge to 71 S.

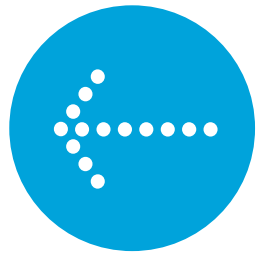
Unbound Youth Prayer Gathering

What is the craziest thing you've seen during 3500 Open?

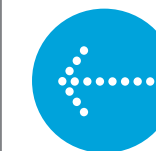
One time a guy came out of the men's bathroom and asked for cleaning supplies because he peed on the toilet seat!
