2025 REPORTING

The Office of the Attorney General (OAG) is anticipated to receive \$46.9 million by 2038. While LD 110, An Act to Require Reporting on the Expenditure of Opioid Settlement Funds by Certain Municipalities and County Governments, applies to subdivisions, the OAG reported its 2025 spending data to support transparency and unified statewide reporting of settlement fund expenditures. Mandatory and voluntary* reporting data submitted by the OAG are presented below.

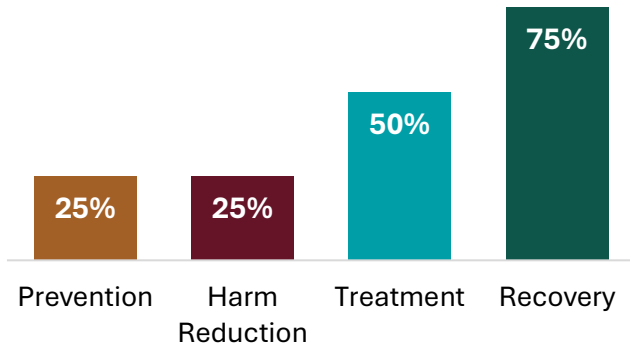

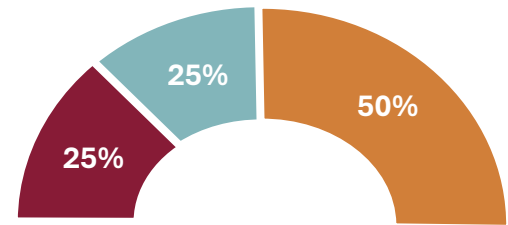
By the OAG occurred across 3 counties in 2025

Legislative public hearings
