Office Electronics May Be 5X Germier Than a Toilet Seat¹

A CloroxPro study of office electronic devices² found that:

- ▶ 100% of office devices were contaminated with bacteria
- ▶ 20% of office laptops tested positive for Staph
- ▶ More than half of users had not cleaned their device in the past month
- ▶ Within 1 day after sanitizing, all devices were recontaminated

Start Every Work Day With Clean Electronics

WHO 	Office Staff All office workers are responsible for cleaning and sanitizing the electronic devices they use at their desk and in communal meeting spaces.
WHEN 	Each Morning Start every day off with clean electronic devices before powering them up for the day.
WHAT 	Office Electronics Laptops, monitors, keyboards, tablets, computer mice, phones and other common office electronic devices.
HOW 	Clean & Sanitize in 3 Simple Steps <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Wipe all external surfaces of the device2. Leave visibly wet for 10 seconds3. Let air dry or use a clean, dry cloth to remove excess liquid and/or buff

PRO TIPS:

To help prevent the spread of germs via office electronic devices, follow these best practices.

- ▶ Wipe from cleanest to dirtiest areas of devices
- ▶ Wipe the outside surfaces of devices first, then the keyboard, and then the screen (as applicable)
- ▶ Wipe larger devices from top to bottom, using an S-shaped pattern
- ▶ Office personnel should wash hands frequently throughout the day (especially after eating, using the restroom, and touching shared surfaces in the office) to avoid recontaminating office electronic devices
