	7-Jan-18		Brachial Stun		Officers were dispatched to a suicidal subject. Upon arriving officers used soft empty hands to take the subject into protective custody. The subject escalated his amount of force to active physical aggression by kicking officers. He also grabbed an officer's leg while being carried to the patrol car. While carrying the subject to the patrol car for transport, the subject was able to turn his head and bite one of the officers on the forearm. A brachial stun was applied to the subject, which was successful in forcing the subject to release from the bite.

The suspect resisted officers' attempts to detain him by offering defensive resistance. The suspect attempted to access his front waistband area for an unknown object. The suspect got free and ran from officers. Officers attempted to Tase the suspect as he ran, but this was ineffective. Officers used a straight punch to the upper body of the suspect in order to overcome his resistance and take him into custody.

The suspect slipped her cuffs in the back seat. Officers used "The Wrap" to accomplish securing the suspect. The suspect sustained (1) small abrasions to her knees, and she complained of pain to generic areas only.

As a result of being taken to the ground the subject obtained some minor scrapes from the roadway.

The subject began to resist by planting his feet out in front of him. When this was not successful the subject tried to pull away from the officers. Officer utilized soft empty hand control to take suspect to the ground to control him while waiting for assist. Assist arrived and suspect continued to resist arrest by tucking his hands and refusing to be handcuffed. A level 2 LVNR was utilized and suspect complied.

When Officers arrived, Fire Officers had the suspect cornered one floor above them in sight. Officers contacted the suspect and told him he was under arrest. The suspect began physically resisting the arrest, and was physically controlled with the application of a Level 3 Lateral Vascular Neck Restraint applied by one of the Officers. The suspect was then rendered unconscious and taken into custody.

Officers attempted to take the suspect into custody and suspect physically resisted leading to a struggle with Officers. Officers utilized soft empty hand control and a level 2 lateral vascular neck restraint to take the suspect into custody.

As the driver exited the vehicle the driver attempted to flee on foot from Officers. Officers apprehended the driver but the driver continued to physically resist. Officers utilized a level 3 LVNR to take the suspect into custody.			
	2-Jul-18		Soft-Empty Hand		Upon making a traffic stop for a misdemeanor investigation, the officer observed drug paraphernalia in plain view and attempted to seize it. The lone occupant of the vehicle made attempts to interfere with that seizure and resisted arrest. During the course of this arrest, the suspect suffered minor injuries.

Drug items were subsequently located on his person at that time. As officers attempted to have the suspect take a seat in their patrol vehicle he removed his right hand from the handcuff. The suspect then defensively resisted attempts to be placed back into custody. An Iron wrist lock takedown combined with another officer restraining the suspects legs was then utilized to restrain the suspect on the ground. The suspect's right hand was then re-secured into the handcuff. The suspect felt he did not have to speak with officers, and ultimately was taken into custody for resist and obstruct.

	20-Jul-18		Soft-Empty Hand Soft-Empty Hand		Officers used soft empty hand control to take a fleeing suspect into custody. The suspect received abrasions and cuts during the incident.			
	6-Aug-18		Soft-Empty Hand Soft-Empty Hand		Officer initiated a traffic stop on a bike with no headlight at night. Suspect fled during the contact and during apprehension, soft empty hand techniques by officers did cause injury to suspects head.			
	7-Aug-18		Taser Taser		Officer was investigating a suspicious vehicle with 4 occupants. During the contact, one male subject fled on foot. Suspect continually ignored commands to stop or get on the ground. Officer caught up to suspect as they entered a dead end area. Officer tased suspect as he was slowing while holding something on his left side and looking back indexing officer. Suspect continued to ignore commands and defensively resist officer and fled again on foot. Suspect was eventually apprehended as assist officers arrived.			
	8-Aug-18		LVNR 2		Officers saturated the area after the termination of a Meridian Police vehicle pursuit that ended in Boise City limits. Suspect then fled on foot after crashing his vehicle. Officer located the suspect running from the scene. Officer gave suspect lawful orders to get on the ground which the suspect ignored. Suspect fled from the officer who tackled him to the ground. Suspect defensively resisted by tensing up and pushing away from the officer. Officer utilized a level 2 LVNR to take him into custody.

	7-Aug-18		Hard Empty Hand Taser Drive Stun LVNR 2		Officers were dispatched to a Problem Subject. The CP provided information that the suspect was homicidal and a danger to family members. The suspect was contacted by officers and used Active Physical Aggression towards officers. Officers used a hard empty hands, a Taser and an LVNR to take the suspect into custody for a 24-hour Mental Hold.			
	26-Aug-18		Taser		A sergeant utilized his taser to overcome the resistance offered by a citizen being arrested for a no contact order violation and an agents warrant.			
	8-Sep-18		Soft-Empty Hand		Officers assisted another agency with a felony stop on a vehicle that had been involved in a pursuit. As the suspect was being placed under arrest he actively resisted, and was subsequently tackled to the ground.			
	9-Sep-18		[No force entered]		Officers were attempting to provide aid to a victim of an aggravated battery when suspect did continuously interfere with these efforts. Suspect was warned several times and was pushed back by officers. Suspect continued his efforts. Officer observed suspects refusal to obey commands and observed suspect continue to interfere. Suspect was placed in an LVNR in an effort to remove him from the emergency situation so as to allow EMS personnel to render aid. During this arrest, a phone located in the front pocket of suspect was damaged.

The call details indicated that a male suspect broke into an office, took a fire extinguisher, and was going after a female subject. Details also indicated that the male broke out a window and the victim and other witnesses had barricaded themselves inside a building for safety. Officer #1 arrived on scene and encountered the suspect who was likely in "Crisis" and violent. Officer #1 used strikes to the suspects face, OC Spray and Baton strikes to the suspect's leg. Officer #2 came to Officer #1's aid and utilized a Level 3 LVNR which was successful and momentarily incapacitated him. The suspect was handcuffed. The suspect was ultimately placed in The Wrap.

Suspect ran through the out doors and down the concourse where there were open gates onto airplanes. Ofc. caught up to suspect and placed him into a level 1 LVNR. Suspect then struggled to get away from the officer, at which time officer assisted suspect to ground with the use of a level 2 LVNR. Suspect again actively tried to get away, at which time officer warned that he may need to apply pressure if suspect continued. Ofc. then attempted to handcuff suspect, at which time suspect actively tried to get away by pushing the officer back into metal chairs. Suspect continued like behavior, and was warned one last time. Suspect again actively resisted and Ofc. began compressions at which time suspect quit resisting, and the suspect was never unconscious. Suspect was handcuffed with assistance from a TSA officer. Suspect was checked by paramedics.

Officer saw suspect get out of a vehicle with three other occupants, and the officer, along with assist officers contacted the suspect at gunpoint and gave him orders to take him into custody. Suspect refused to obey the orders given to him and the officer kicked the suspect, attempting to strike him in the common peroneal, however the suspect moved and was struck in the buttocks. The officer immediately took the suspect to the ground by the arm/shoulder and held him at gunpoint while other officers placed him into handcuffs.

Suspect tried to flee from police detention/arrest for Disturbing the Peace. Suspect resisted arrest by actively flailing and kicking to avoid being handcuffed by Detective. Suspect reportedly sustained unknown injuries to his person.

	10-Oct-18		LVNR 1 Soft-Empty Hand Soft-Empty Hand		During an arrest, the suspect tried to flee while being handcuffed then kicked one officer. The officer making the arrest applied a level 1 LVNR then took the suspect to the ground after she kicked the assist officer.

Liberty St. B204. The suspect fled the apartment from officers during contact. Officers pursued him on foot and utilized soft, empty-hand control to take the suspect to the ground. Officers also had to utilize a hard, empty-hand hammer fist strike to the super scapula of the suspect. Suspect was placed into custody.			
	22-Oct-18		LVNR 3 Soft-Empty Hand		Officers responded to 8475 W. Westchester Ave. in Boise for a burglary in progress. An officer used a level 3 LVNR to gain control of, and ultimately arrest, the suspect.

As the officer contacted the suspect he punched and also grabbed onto her uniform. The suspect then fell over a concrete bench, and while on the ground he continued to grab and punch at the officer. During the incident the suspect sustained a small abrasion with swelling under his left eye.			
	24-Oct-18		LVNR 3 LVNR 3		An Officer contacted a subject seated in his vehicle in front of the Jacksons gas station. A second subject came from inside the store and attempted to enter the same vehicle. The Officer had the second subject wait and sit on the ground. A second Officer arrived on scene which prompted the subject seated on the ground to get up and run from the scene. The second Officer gave chase and caught the subject behind the Jacksons. An LVNR hold was used to control the fleeing subject's active resistance while taking him into custody.

Upon arrival, the suspect pulled the Security officer towards him. The Security officer broke free from the man's grip and the man took off running. Our Officer yelled "Boise Police, stop!", but the suspect continued running. The Officer yelled for him to stop again adding "You are under arrest!" but the subject continued to run. The Officer was able to catch up and grab the suspect by the arm, but he broke free.
