10 X Investments began investing money in 2007 and currently has R40 billion under management. We manage a range of investments from pensions to discretionary investments.

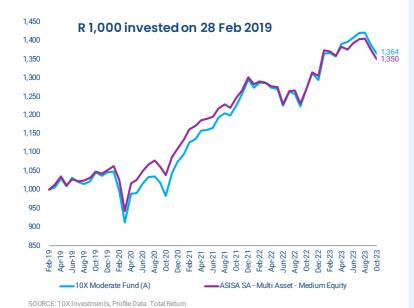
10X Index Fund Managers has been authorised since 2018 as a manager of Collective Investment Schemes.
