This represents a record for Andermatt Swiss Alps in terms of sales rate for a new project and is testament to not only the popularity of this stylish and innovative new development but also the growing demand for real estate in Andermatt.

The apartments have been designed with an innovative Japanese mezzanine style concept. As such, the majority of the apartments feature a spacious mezzanine level and huge double height living space with a ceiling height of up to nearly five metres. All the apartments have been designed to maximise space and light, with clever features such as built-in-furniture and large double height windows.

The apartments will be delivered to a high specification with brands such as Grohe and V-Zug throughout. As always, the building incorporates the finest Swiss design and quality that is now synonymous with the Andermatt Swiss Alps brand.
