After the tragic events of September 11, 2001, I began devoting much of my time supporting the men and women who were deploying in response to those attacks—the brave service members who, each day, protect and defend our great country. Having veterans in my own family, and having been involved with supporting our military veterans going back to the '70s, '80s and '90s, it was after that terrible day I decided to become much more active for our defenders however and wherever I could.

A few years after 9/11, I visited local NY firehouses, befriended many firefighters, and have supported the FDNY through numerous efforts, including raising funds to build The Brooklyn Wall of Remembrance in honor of all 416 first responders lost on that terrible morning. Through the Disabled American Veterans organization, I found it my mission to do all I could to support our wounded heroes and their families. And by getting involved with many other veterans initiatives, I began to support the children of the fallen, Gold and Blue Star Families, and wherever I could serve and honor a need within the military, veteran and first responder communities.

Over the years, I have met many dedicated people who are also actively working to do the same, and I have tried to do what I can to support their efforts as well as spearhead many projects on my own in support of those who are currently serving, have served, our first responders, and the families who serve alongside them. I've traveled to visit our troops in Iraq, Afghanistan and around the world, and have also performed with my band (Gary Sinise & the Lt. Dan Band) in Kuwait, Afghanistan, Belgium, the Netherlands, Germany, Italy, United Kingdom, Japan, Okinawa, Korea, Singapore, Diego Garcia, Guantanamo Bay, Alaska and throughout the U.S. in an effort to help boost the morale of our troops and military families. Through my travels I've seen first-hand the extraordinary dedication of our service members.

My personal mission is what led to the founding of the Gary Sinise Foundation in 2011, and with the help of supporters like you, we will continue to expand this mission in support of our nation's defenders, veterans, first responders and their loved ones, while upholding the importance of keeping our country strong by taking care of those who serve. While our programs and projects have certainly made a difference in many lives, there's much more work to be done. In June, the Gary Sinise Foundation celebrated its 7th Anniversary. It has been my true privilege to serve as Executive Director since the Foundation's outset. Together with your generosity, we have made a positive impact on the lives of so many American heroes and their loved ones.

This annual report will provide you with a comprehensive update regarding every Gary Sinise Foundation program. Last year, 91.12% of every dollar raised was applied directly to supporting our defenders and their families. Our commitment to fiscal responsibility and efficiency in all we do earned us a Gold Seal of Transparency from Guidestar. And I am so proud to announce we are now listed on Charity Navigator, having received their coveted four-star rating in our very first year of eligibility.

We continued to expand throughout 2017 by launching our newest programs, Snowball Express and our Center for Education & Outreach. Additionally, we are now accepting 8-10 new heroes each year into our specially adapted smart home program. Our local and national in-kind partners have been absolutely essential to the success of this program, not only by securing product and services for each home, but by donating their most precious asset: their time. This above-and-beyond generosity allows us to grow this program while keeping overhead low. From Gary's early involvement in 2010 through the Gary Sinise Foundation's efforts today, we have completed 50 forever homes for America's severely injured heroes and their loved ones with 20 more currently underway.

Over the years, I have seen first-hand how Gary's work has improved the lives of our nation's defenders. Nearly forty years later, he is still forging close relationships with those we serve. Our entire organization follows in his footsteps. We believe there is no substitute for personal interactions, sincere gratitude, and meaningful connections.

Our specially adapted smart homes provide a safe haven for these heroes to reclaim their independence. Built from the ground up with their individual needs in mind, these homes alleviate stress on the entire family.
