Aims of the Special Issue

This special issue aims to identify and highlight the ideas currently germinating in psychology that have the potential to become big ideas that make a lasting contribution to the field, generating important new research for many years. The papers may pertain to any domain or subdiscipline of psychology. We encourage fruitful integrations across subdisciplines of psychology and between psychology and related fields. All contributors should be attentive to issues of diversity in their papers, i.e., variations by ethnicity, gender, social class, and culture. Where appropriate, papers should also include policy implications and recommendations.

Manuscript Submission

Letters of Intent should include manuscript title, author names and affiliations, and a 500-word (maximum) abstract of the proposed submission. Abstracts should explain how the proposed paper will address the goals of the special issue. Letters of Intent and all inquiries should be sent to Pat King, <u>patk0115@yahoo.com</u>.

Potential contributors whose Letters of Intent have been approved will be invited to submit a full manuscript. Please note that all papers will be peer-reviewed and there is no guarantee of acceptance.

Full manuscripts must be prepared according to the Manuscript Submission guidelines on the Review of General Psychology home page and submitted electronically via the journal's manuscript submission portal.
