

Counties Freestyle Pricing Schedule

Valid from 1 April 2020



What you pay for power is made up of charges from a number of companies, including the generator, your local lines company, the company that provides the meter on your house, and your retailer (that's us!). The Electricity Authority also charges you a levy and the government adds GST.

To know if you're a standard or low user, simply look at your usage over the past year. If it's more than 8000 kWh then you'll be a standard user; if it's less than 8000 kWh a year, then you'll be a low user.
