Scopus Certification Program for Librarians

Are you looking to expand your expertise in training and consulting users? The Scopus Certification program provides insight into research sources, collaboration and metrics that can support your work.



Format

Six online courses (approximately one hour each) on the Canvas learning management system.

Courses consist of short video tutorials, exercises and quizzes, and support materials.

Course topics:

- *Topical Search*
- *Author Identity*
- *Metrics*
- *APIs*
- *Institutional Insights*
- *User Outreach*



Cohorts

Courses are divided into cohorts made up of approximately 25 librarians to promote discussion and sharing insights. Training may be offered regionally or within a global cohort.

Prerequisite

Participants must be librarians or information managers at an institution or company with a Scopus subscription. If you are interested in taking Scopus Certification alongside a Scopus trial, please contact your Elsevier representative.



Certification

To become certified, participants must achieve 80% or more on each of the six course quizzes. Participants may retake a quiz if they don't achieve the necessary mark the first time and are provided with references to the necessary course materials to review. Participants who successfully complete the course can download a certificate of completion.
