

#### Your access through Bond University



- Note: If you have ever used an Elsevier product (ClinicalKey, Science Direct, Scopus) using your Bond email, please Log In instead of registering for a new account






# Getting started with ClinicalKey Student

#### Dive right in

- Search for an anatomical structure or medical condition
- Filter by type to view related book, image and video content
- Narrow search results by specialty to identify relevant content
- View a quick access summary to quickly get to grips with key medical conditions



### Build your own bookshelf

- Add a book to your digital Bookshelf by clicking on "Add to bookshelf" from inside a chapter of a book
- Make notes and highlight important information inside text
- Build your own flashcards to quiz yourself on key concepts and review later
- Listen to a book by using the Read aloud feature within Bookshelf





## Test your knowledge

- Create a test by going to the Question Bank tab, then Create a test, or by clicking on 'Create a test' from the homepage
- Choose Basic Science or Clinical Medicine Question bank
- Filter by systems or disciplines and select one or multiple topics
- Choose type of questions, study or exam mode, number of questions
- Click 'Start my Test'



#### Study mode or exam mode

- The Exam mode is designed in a way to simulate your exam. You get through all the questions and get feedback at the end of the test
- In Study mode, you get access to the feedback after each question. This enables you to correct any misunderstanding before moving to the next question

**TIP:** In Exam mode you can highlight keywords in the text and cross out any answer choices you've ruled as not relevant

# Receive feedback with detailed explanations

- For each question you will get detailed explanations for all the answer choices
- In Study mode, those explanations are displayed as you submit each answer
- In Exam mode, those explanations are displayed at the end of the test
- See how much time you spent on the question





## Get recommendations on where to focus next

- View key concepts to focus your study or revision based on your incorrect answers to the test
- Access textbook sections on each of those key concepts to close any knowledge gaps
- Retake incorrect questions to check if you've made progress



## View your performance over time

- View your performance per topic and most challenging topics by clicking on the Performance tab
- Review, retake and resume any previous test by clicking on the Question bank tab, then Previous tests
