1. Please briefly describe who you are and your institution?

I am Kurmet Danebek a nursing student in my junior year at Nazarbayev University School of Medicine, in Kazakhstan.

2. What problem(s) were you attempting to solve with ClinicalKey?

I had some issues finding the clinical cases of pathologies with accessible media. Because the medical media is not easily searchable on the internet, I was glad to find the media I was looking for in my nursing course presentations. A lot of what I found on the internet was old media. In my native Kazakh and Russian languages, I could not find enough statistics and media for the simple nursing assignments.

3. What three benefits have you experienced since using ClinicalKey?

First and foremost, I really enjoy the search bar... It gave me more control on what kind of materials I would like to see. Secondly, the content was new for me.
