



## Rainforests with Cam and Dash





Cam is a chameleon. Dash is a sloth. Unlike Dash's name suggests, they are rather slow moving animals but that's because they don't need to move much. See, they live way up in trees in tropical rainforests of Central and South America.

## Facts about rainforests

- 1. Rainforests are one of the richest habitats on the planet, with thousands of species even on a single tree.
- 2. Tropical rainforests are found in areas very close to the equator.
- 3. Annual rainfall in a tropical rainforest can reach up to 10 metres.



- 7. One of the most colourful family of rainforest animals are the 100 plus species of poison dart frogs.
- 8. The Amazon is the largest rainforest in the world and covers nearly 40% of South America.
- 9. A sloth takes one month to digest one leaf and they are totally blind.
- Chameleons usually change their colour to control their body temperature and their feet act like salad tongs.
