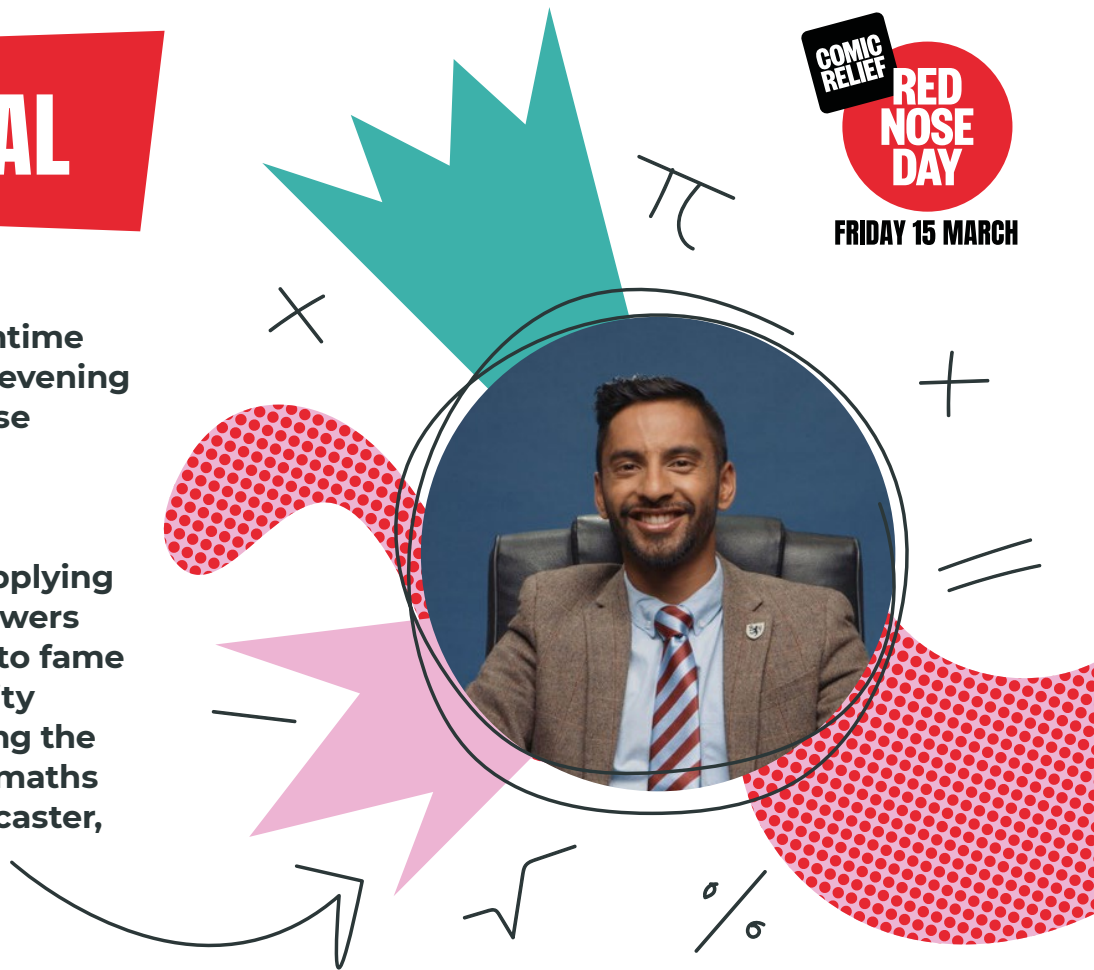


GET QUIZZICAL
