A HANDY GUIDE FOR SCHOOL COUNCILS



1. Get Red Nose Day in the diary

Friday 21 March is Red Nose Day, so make sure everyone in the school council has it in the diary. Tell all your teachers, parents and carers too.

2. Pick your fundraising activities

Whether it's throwing a bake sale for The Big 40th Birthday Bake, taking on an epic physical challenge, or simply wearing something red, pick some activities then get sponsored or collect donations. You'll find ideas to get you started at **comicrelief.com/schools**

3. Round up a Red Nose Day team

Ask your teacher for ideas on who might like to help, and make sure people know who to talk to if they want to get involved.

4. Divide and conquer

Make sure everyone knows what they're doing, whether it's downloading our free quiz pack or making bunting and putting up posters.

5. Go cashless

Talk to your teacher about activating the JustGiving page set up when they registered, or ask them about using ParentPay. If you received QR stickers in your fundraising packs- stick these on posters- when scanned they will link direct to your JustGiving page – clever!

6. Download everything you need
