Breaking the rules and raising the cash:

Set them a target to hit and nominate

- 1. Choose the lesson you want to disrupt - a whole afternoon. registration or PSHE - it's up to you.
- 2. Set a fundraising target ask your students to donate to take part.
- 3. Choose one, two or more 'rules' to break - you can choose yourself or ask your students to vote.

Educating your students:

- 4. Download and teach our lesson plan all about young activists, pushing back against injustices they've witnessed, all whilst abiding by your chosen 'rules'.
- 5. Show the students what they're rebelling for - go to comicrelief.com/rebellion and learn all about a young girl called Precious and how your donation is making a difference to her life.

Getting your own back:

6. We've lined up a series of celebrity 'rebel rousers' to add some fun by disrupting your day further. You will be sent a secret link to 'The Big Red **Button of Rebellion'** the week of Red Nose Day. Once pressed a 'task' will be set and must be completed*

Some rules are made to be broken

We've selected some 'rules' vou might want to break, but feel free to pick your own.

- 1. Sit still. Every time the teacher says 'class' or 'quiet,' students move one seat to the left.
- 2. No eating in class. As a special treat for their £££'s, students are allowed to chomp snacks during class - the more rustly the packet, the better.
- 3. Full uniform must be worn. Out with uniform, in with red, or just anything that brings you joy - for teachers and students.
- 4. Focus on the lesson. The first 15 minutes of the lesson must be spent chatting about anything except school. Because we all know, it's good to talk.

Power in numbers

Like all great rebellions, to make a big impact, we need numbers. Because we know that when people come together, great things can happen. And we know that when times get tough, people get tougher. People are kinder, more compassionate, more determined, more generous. We're inviting you to come together and raise some all important cash.

MEET KAITLYN, 19 Blackpool, UK

When Kaitlyn was 18, she found herself homeless and used to walk all night because she was afraid to sleep rough on the streets.

Thanks to Streetlife, which is funded by Comic Relief, Kaitlyn now has shelter and support. She has become actively involved in country walking and mountaineering, is volunteering at local charities, and wants to be a support worker for other young people.



MEET PRECIOUS, 14 Lusaka, Zambia

Precious lives in a community with high rates of poverty, gangs, drug abuse and gender-based violence. Caring for her mum and responsible for most of the household work, Precious felt lonely and had lost hope.

The 'Rise Up Girls!' project – run by Circus Zambia and funded by Comic Relief – has changed Precious' life. Alongside training in circus skills, Precious has learnt about gender equality, sexual and reproductive health rights, and advocacy. Today, with her self-belief sky-high, Precious has new hope for the future and aspires to a career in law.

FUNDRAISERS IN ACTION


