


Bluey loves to go for a walk and explore the world around her! For some extra Red Nose Day fun, why not go on your very own Bluey adventure walk with your little ones?

- While you're out adventuring, remind your little ones what to look out for. Ask questions to get them searching, talking, counting and having fun, for example:
 - Can you find a green leaf? How about a yellow one?
 - How many birds can you see flying in the sky?
 - Who can find the tallest tree?
 - What noise does a bee make? Where might you find one?
 - Are there lots of clouds today? Do you think it's going to rain?
 - What's your favourite type of stick? Thick? Thin? Long? Short? Curvy?
- Once you're back from the walk, talk with your little ones about all the exciting things you discovered. This is a great way to start a conversation about the seasons. What would have been different if you'd gone adventuring in the summer or autumn?
- Fill in the 'What did you spot?' sheet. You could either do this as a group or print off a copy of the sheet for the children to fill in themselves (show them how to do a tick!).








