DELIVERING THE ASSEMBLY



The Red Nose Day assembly should take around 15 minutes to deliver.

You could choose to deliver it to your form, a year group, or the whole school.

In the film, we hear from 14-year-old Precious, whose life has been transformed by the 'Rise Up Girls!' project run by Circus Zambia and funded by Comic Relief.

Slide 5 gives some examples of how the money you raise on Red Nose Day could be used to make a difference to families in the UK and around the world. You could use the facts and figures on this slide to discuss a possible fundraising target with the students.

Slide 7 and 8 have been left blank for you to customise with your own plans (you can delete these if you don't have anything up your sleeve yet). Use slide 8 if your school is joining in with the Red Nose Day Rebellion. The sky's the limit on Red Nose Day, so think big, bold and brave!

Talking points

Use these talking points to extend the assembly and get the pupils engaged and involved.

- How has money raised on Red Nose Day helped Precious?
- How much money shall we try to raise this Red Nose Day?
- What fundraising activities can you remember doing in the past?
