We would like your child to be able to save any work they do in the Code Editor and on the project site. To do this, they will need access to a Raspberry Pi Foundation account. If they are 13 or olde they can create an account themselves. If they are under 13, you will have to sign up for an account them, as follows:	r,
1. Go to projects.raspberrypi.org	
2. In the top right corner, click on 'Log in'.	
3. On the login screen, click on 'Create one' — this is at the bottom of the box in the middle of the scre	en.
4. On the next screen, click on 'Under 13'.	
5. Fill in the details with <b>your own email address</b> and a username for your child. Do not use their real name for this.	I
6. Fill in the other information and make note of the username and password.	
7. Verify the account by clicking the link in the email that will be sent to the address you provided.	
Please ensure that your child has the username or email address along with the password so they can log in during their Code Club session. Please be aware that we will not be able to reset their password for them, should they forget it.	′
