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# Teréga signs a Charter for Responsible Supplier Relations

At the Salon des Achats expo in Bordeaux, Teréga reaffirms its Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) strategy and signs a Charter for Responsible Supplier Relations. This proactive initiative is a perfect extension of the commitments outlined in the company's strategic plan, IMPACTS 2025.

With this charter, Teréga reaffirms the principles it has already adopted, including the development of an environmental policy, fairness toward suppliers, and a reliance on local companies. In concrete terms, over the last three years Teréga has worked with more than 700 companies in the region, representing 50% of its purchasing volumes.

Having already established itself as a vehicle for "good practices", Teréga is relentlessly focused on its environmental impacts. The "BE Positif" programme (Bilan Environnemental Positif), launched in 2017, aims to gradually erase the overall environmental footprint of its transport and storage businesses, with the goal of achieving a zero-carbon footprint by 2020—and eventually creating some environmental value. Its concern for these issues is unmistakably reflected in its decision to select "green label" suppliers, as well as its 2018 signature of a green energy contract.

In addition, Teréga continues to select its suppliers based on Health, Safety & Environment (HSE) criteria, and certifies them for a period of three years. This certification not only aims to cultivate a strong HSE culture, but also nudges our clients toward progress in these areas.

Through the ten principles enshrined in the charter, Teréga seeks to strengthen its position as a socially responsible employer and strive toward improvement as a player in the energy transition.
